Research Committee

The Occupational Science Europe Research Committee (OSERC) has for the last three months been working on a natural follow-up on the short survey done in 2018. We are planning to do a mapping of OS research done in Europe and so far, we are busy going through journals from the last 5 years.

Interdisciplinary Committee

The Interdisciplinary Committee currently works on two tasks. First, it is focusing on possibilities to create a more interdisciplinary OSE conference. Second, it discusses on a more theoretical level why OS claims to be interdisciplinary, and what kind of challenges and benefits are created through an interdisciplinary focus.

Social Media Committee

The Social Media Committee is responsible for dissemination and information exchange within and outside the network. This committee supports networking by providing freely available online resources for sharing news and information, opportunities for the development of occupational science, links to other sites and discussion forums.

Language Groups

French Speaking

In the past months, due to the COVID19, most members of the <u>Francophone Society</u> <u>for Occupational Science (SFRO)</u> were busy reengineering their everyday professional occupations, trying to adapt to the ongoing changing circumstances. Various events and conferences were cancelled or postponed to 2021. In order to support people in the management of the disruption caused by COVID-19 several colleagues from France and Canada have translated or created various leaflets and documents, made available online. Others started web surveys in order to understand how the covid has affected everyday life occupations. Finally, in close relation with the editorial board of the Journal of Occupational Science (JOS), the SFRO is still in the process of building a strategy to translate the forthcoming abstracts of articles of the JOS in French.

D'autres ont lancé des enquêtes en ligne afin de comprendre comment le COVID a affecté les occupations quotidienne. Enfin, en étroite relation avec le comité éditorial du Journal of Occupational Science (JOS), la SFRO est en train de définir une stratégie pour traduire les prochains résumés d'articles du JOS en français.

German Speaking

News from the German Occupational Science Group

Following the OSE conference 2017, a German Occupational Science Group (deutsche Occupational Science, dOS) was developed. Currently, dOS consists of around 50 members with backgrounds in research, education and practice.

In 2018 the dOS Mission Statement was developed and published in the Journal ergoscience. One of the dOS goals is to make international OS literature accessible in the German language and to provide German Occupational Science literature and research.

Clare Hocking, editor of the Journal of Occupational Science (JOS), submitted the offer to translate and publish three basic articles for the German speaking audience. Gratefully accepting this offer the dOS-Group developed criteria and analysed systematically all abstracts of the JOS articles in the period from 2001 to 2017. After having selected these articles, the translation is now in planning.

Currently, dOS is working on a commented OS-reading list for lectures, students and researchers.
